'Delancey Street' wins development award

The Urban Land Institute, a real-estate development organization, has recognized the Delancey Street Foundation in San Francisco with an Award of Excellence.

Backen, Arrigoni & Ross, a San Francisco-based architecture firm, designed the \$31 million rehabilitation facility for

recovering alcoholics, drug addicts and ex-convicts at 600 The Embarcadero. The project – comprised of housing, public facilities and street-level shops – was built as a cooperative venture between the San Francisco Building Trades Council and 250 Delancey Street residents, who hammered together most of their new home themselves.

The institute, based in Washington, D.C., honored eight developments at its Oct. 23 meeting in Los Angeles.
